2. (a) Discuss the circumstances under which polygamy is practised in Uganda. (13 marks)
- (b) Account for the declining rate of polygamy today. (12 marks)
3. (a) “Ugandan parents face a lot of problems in raising their children.” Discuss some of these problems. (13 marks)
- (b) What guidance should Christians give to parents to enable them deal with these problems effectively? (12 marks)
4. To what extent can the Church in Uganda take blame for *the rising cases of HIV/AIDS* in the country? (25 marks)

## SECTION B

### WORK, LEISURE AND MONEY

5. The late Mwalimu Julius Nyerere once said, “Treat a visitor as a visitor for two days and on the third day, give him a hoe.”
  - (a) Discuss the statement in light of the traditional African understanding of work. (12 marks)
  - (b) Explain the biblical teaching of work. (13 marks)
6. Discuss the strengths and limitations of MDD as a way of spending leisure time today. (25 marks)
7. With reference to biblical knowledge, explain the ways in which a Christian should earn and use his money. (25 marks)

8. “The government of Uganda launched a long term plan called the *Uganda Vision 2040* which outlines the path that the nation will take to achieve prosperity by 2040.”
- (a) In reference to this vision, examine the likely obstacles to its fulfillment. *(13 marks)*
- (b) Examine the ways in which the Church can help to overcome such obstacles. *(12 marks)*
